ALLEA Scientific Symposium: Science in Times of Challenged Trust and Expertise

16 May 2018 (11:30 – 18:00)

Is there a loss of trust (worthiness) in science and expertise? Are “fake news” and/or the digital transformation of social interactions and information really moving us towards a post-fact era? What can science do about it? Keynote speakers will address these and other questions at the symposium “Science in Times of Challenged Trust and Expertise”. As proponents of evidence-based reasoning, but also as institutions highly affected by this change, the symposium provides academics a platform to debate the challenges they face. This interdisciplinary and pan-European symposium aims at exploring notions of the alleged loss of trust in research and evidence, its underlying causes, questions on how valid knowledge can and should be acquired and communicated, and how different academic disciplines are dealing with it. The ALLEA Prize is annually awarded to eminent scholars whose work represents a significant contribution to the cultural and intellectual values of Europe and to the idea of European integration, thereby promoting and strengthening an understanding of Europe as multifaceted, intellectual, open and vibrant. SAPEA symposium: Science Advice for Policy by European Academies

17 May 2018 (8:30 – 13:00)

How has science advice been re-imagined at the European level? The experiences and insights of SAPEA and the European Commission’s Scientific Advice Mechanism will be discussed with practical examples and lessons learned from the most recent experiences. A wide range of different national perspectives on science advice systems will be examined. This will be followed by discussions of recent examples of scientific advice that have been produced by the European Commission’s High Level Group of Scientific Advisors, in collaboration with SAPEA. The event will offer the opportunity to engage with recent developments in scientific advice in general, as well as developments resulting from specific recent examples. In this way it will explore aspects of successful science advice, its uptake, implementation and the challenges faced. These sessions will also cover the lessons that can be learned when it comes to trust and distrust in science, the timeliness of advice, as well as acceptance and uptake of advice. [Read more](#)
