Session 2: Global Health

1. Background

The Alliance of International Science Organizations (ANSO) is a non-profit and nongovernment international scientific organization founded in 2018 by 37 international science and education organizations around the world. It is committed to promoting shared sustainable development and the advancement of the UN Sustainable Development Goals through promoting and implementing concrete international cooperative initiatives in Science, Technology, Innovation and Capacity Building.

The 2nd ANSO General Assembly (GA) scheduled in May 2020 was postponed due to the worldwide outbreak of COVID-19. Discussed and agreed by the ANSO Governing Board (GB) during its 3rd annual meeting on 9th Nov. 2020, the 2nd ANSO GA was re-scheduled in 2021, and a series of topic focused online meetings will be co-organized with ANSO Members and Partners, which include 1) Climate Change and Its Impact, 2) Public Health and Food Safety, 3) Agriculture, 4) Biodiversity, 5) Fundamental Science and Higher Education, 6) Ecology and Green Technology, and 7) Innovation and Tech-Transfer.

2. About this Session – Global Health

Global health is an area for study, research, and practice that places a priority on improving health and achieving equity in health for all people worldwide (*Koplan PJ, 2009*). In a globalized world, there are no isolated places, problems and solutions transcend national borders, creating the need for international cooperation and the elimination of differences between internal and external national responses. The basis for understanding global health, but also planetary and One-health, as new concepts and new strategic approaches in the third millennium, can be found in the historical development of globalization and international health. The one after another COVID-19 waves make everyone aware that no country can be safe from this virus until the rapid spread is stopped everywhere. Today, the Sustainable Development Goals are a cornerstone for a minimum set of standards in

moving toward global equity in health care delivery, and leadership in global health issues encompasses all levels of society.

Numerous global health challenges are interrelated, such as global warming and natural and man-made disasters, floods, drinking water shortages and deforestation, contributing to the loss of demographic balance, economic divisions, forced migration, poverty, hunger and endangering entire populations. In addition to these challenges, global health is also associated with those related to the exchange of scientific and technological advances in medicine and the use of effective preventive technologies in all countries of the world, such as tools to increase health literacy.

Finally, global health requires cooperation, coordination and opportunities to exchange ideas and learn from experiences and examples of good practice, and the goal is to develop joint action that will protect and improve the health of all people in the world. It is an extensive multi-sectoral area that connects not only the main areas of development policy, humanitarian aid, research and health, but also trade and international policy. Today, health is one of the global priorities, which is the result of undoubted scientific evidence on the connection between health and economic development. COVID-19 shows how health is becoming a global issue affecting all sectors of the economy and politics, and requires coordinated international responses.

This workshop will invite a number of top experts on epidemiology, public health and risk management / governance from Europe and Asia, talking about the insights, lessons and suggestions to COVID-19 pandemic and global one-health development.
