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Imposing particular identities: The balkans as a meeting place of ethnicities and religions

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Abstract

Since Balkan ethnicities are primarily organized along locally-practiced religious lines regional monotheistic religions are seen as the source of the conflicts there. However even a brief historical examination shows different patterns where the people of the region lived in long periods of peace and solidarity while practicing their separate religious traditions. Significantly the conflicts occurred when the Balkan people followed non-religious political processes and ideas which originated outside of the region.
